Instructions: The application package must be complete and arranged in the order described below. All original transcripts, letters of recommendation and other required documents must be received by the chapter chairman, by the deadline, in a single package as described. If your school requires that any documents be sent to another party, the applicant must arrange with the chapter to receive the documents and forward them with the application in one package, to the chapter chairman before the deadline. Typewritten application and statements preferred. Photographs should not be included. This scholarship is judged and awarded without regard to gender, race, color, religion, national origin or disability.

1. Scholarship Application (this page).
2. Financial Need Form is required and will be used the event two candidates are equally qualified. The student with the most need will be chosen as the recipient.
3. Applicant must prepare a statement of 1,000 words or less setting forth his/her career objectives, specifying how college major (if required) or college plans relate to future professional goals, and reasons for these choices.
4. Original transcript of high school or college grades (as applicable). Original high school transcripts must indicate class rank/class size and test scores, unless home schooled. Home-schooled students include grade transcripts for grade 9 through the current year.
5. List on one side of an 8 ½” x 11” paper: extra-curricular activities, honors received scholastic achievements, or other significant accomplishments. Maximum 2 pages.
6. Letters of recommendation from at least two but not more than four persons in authority from the high school or college the applicant now attends or person known to applicant, who are familiar with the applicant’s work. Letter may cover the applicant’s ability, work habits, integrity, character, potential and volunteer activities.
7. Photocopy of United States Citizenship: photocopy of birth certificate, naturalization papers or information page of US Passport.
8. Application package should be stapled or paper clipped in the top, left hand corner. Number of pages in package must not exceed 15.
9. It is the responsibility of the applicant to correctly identify the complete address for the college/university department to receive and credit the scholarship funds awarded.

CHAPTER GUIDELINES FOR CHAPTERS SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS

ALEXIS C. BUSKIRK MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

“To the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) for the creation of funds for an education scholarship for students who are in financial need, and who might not otherwise be able to receive an education but for such contribution of scholarship funds. DAR may utilize ten percent (10%) of such bequest for administrative handling of said scholarship.”

1. All deadlines must be observed; applications not meeting the deadlines will be disqualified. The current deadline for this scholarship shall be April 1, for awards made in the spring with distribution in the fall.
2. We will currently award one scholarships of \$1,000 each for the Fall Semester as funds allow.
3. We will try to inflation proof our Investment Funds by paying out minimum expenses for tax filings, awarding scholarships as revenue permits and securing our scholarships with safe investments which are in funds that are guaranteed by either FDIC and or Investment Funds..
4. We will award scholarship awards to deserving applicants who show both desire to attend a school of higher education or trade schools and, to honor Alexis Buskirk, we will strive to award to students in financial need that might not otherwise receive an education.
5. Scholarship committee will choose the applicant award winners from the applications received by the due date. Award winners will then be presented their awards at the annual awards ceremony in March if possible or at a later regular meeting with distribution in the fall.
6. The committee shall include members of the Colonel John Mitchell Chapter willing to serve on the scholarship committee.
7. Applicants must be US Citizens.
8. Students must maintain a “C” average or grades as required by the school of the degree program he or she has entered.
